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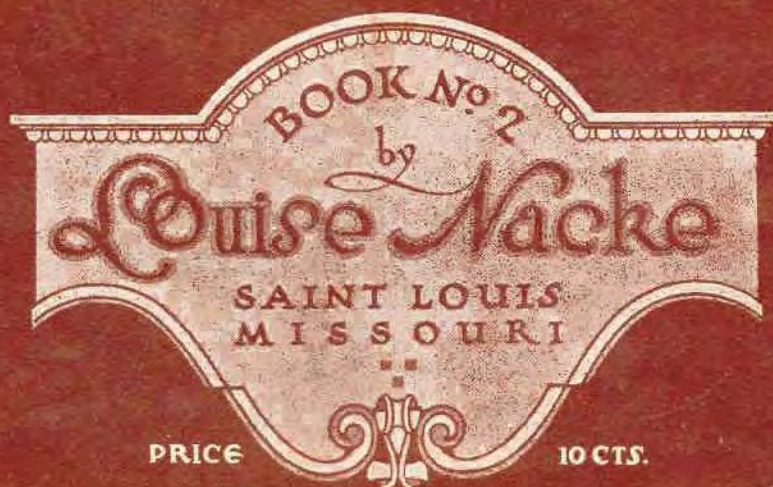

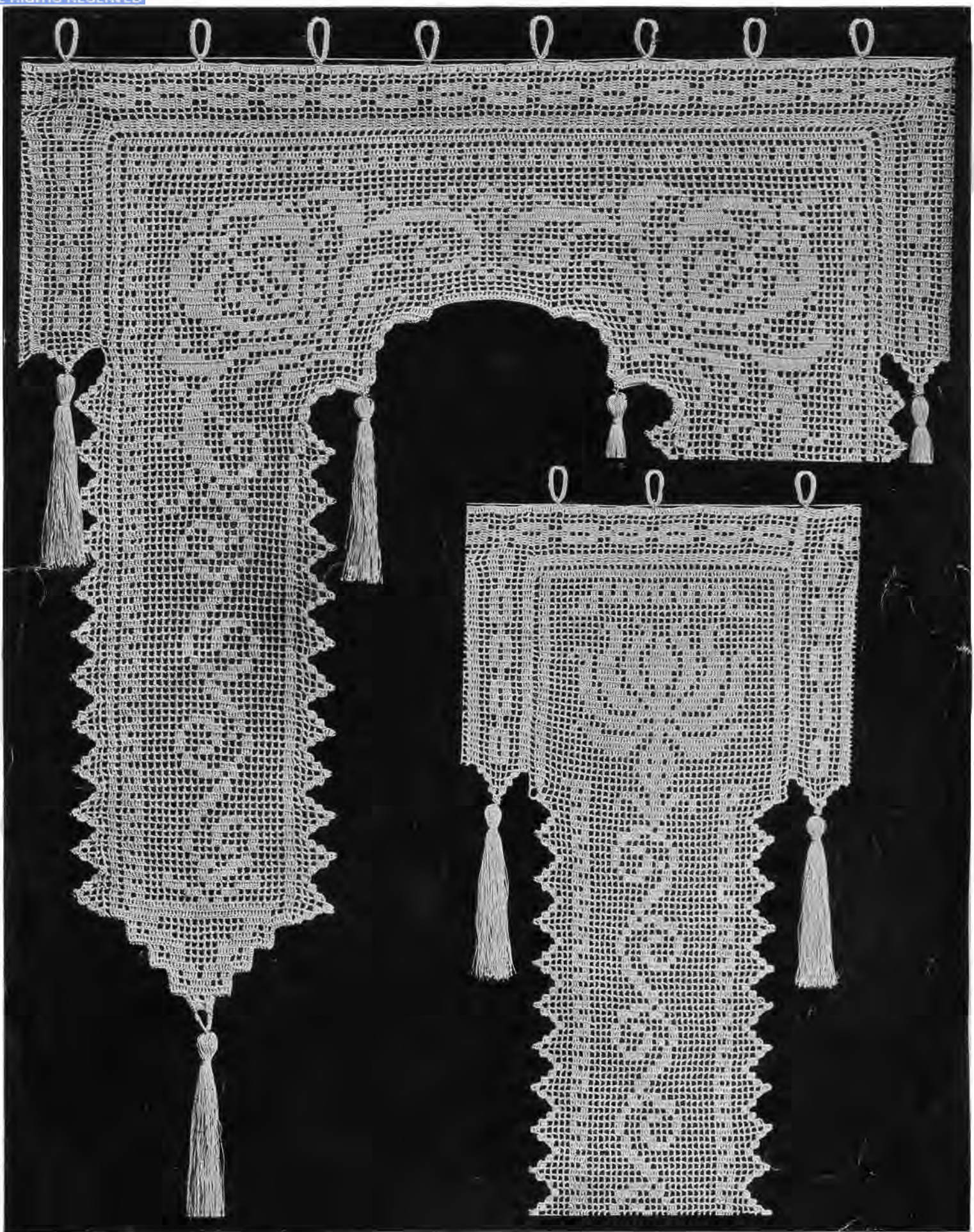


Plate No. 1. Enlarged detail of Portiere shown on Front Cover Page. Carpet Warp was used to make this Portiere.

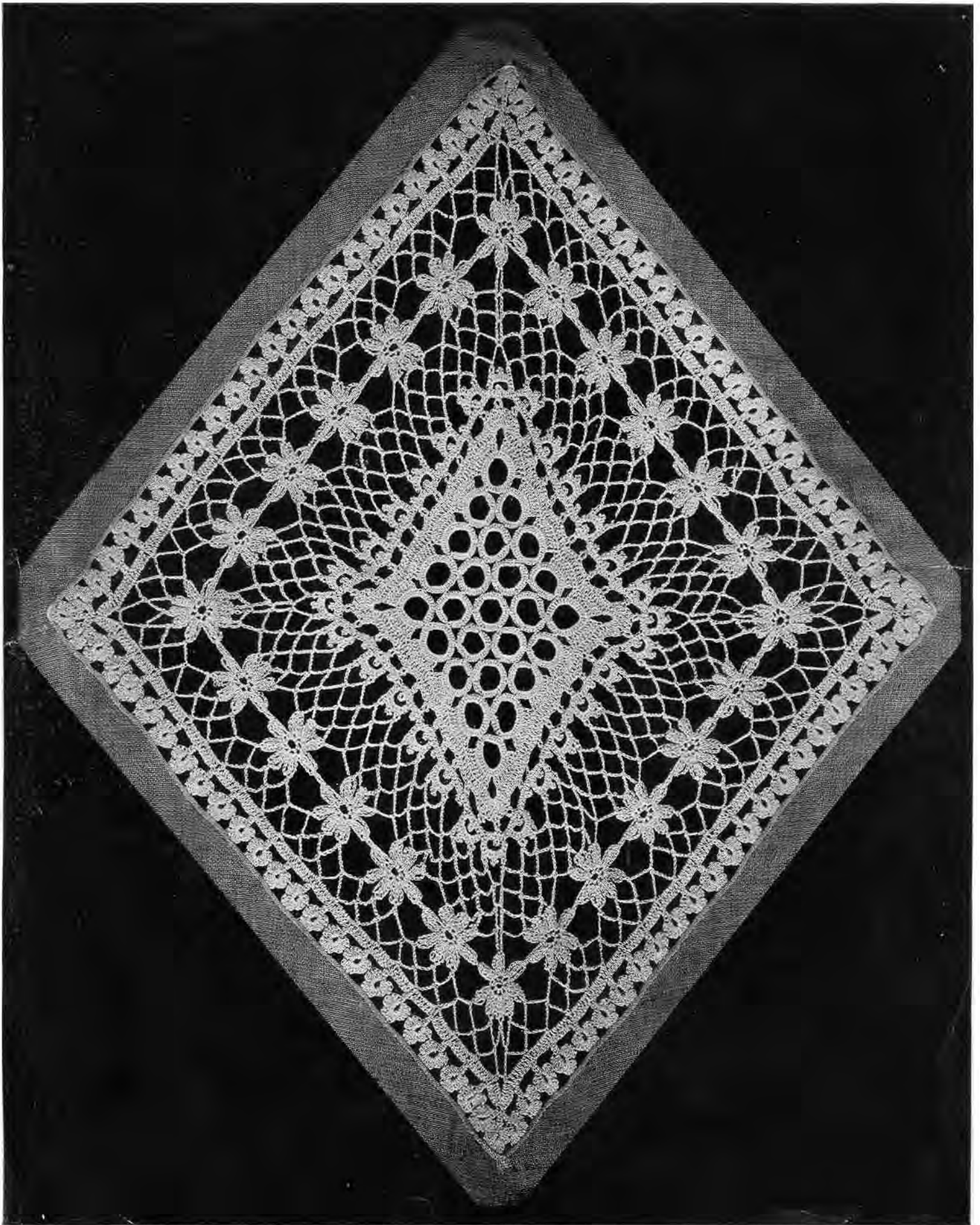
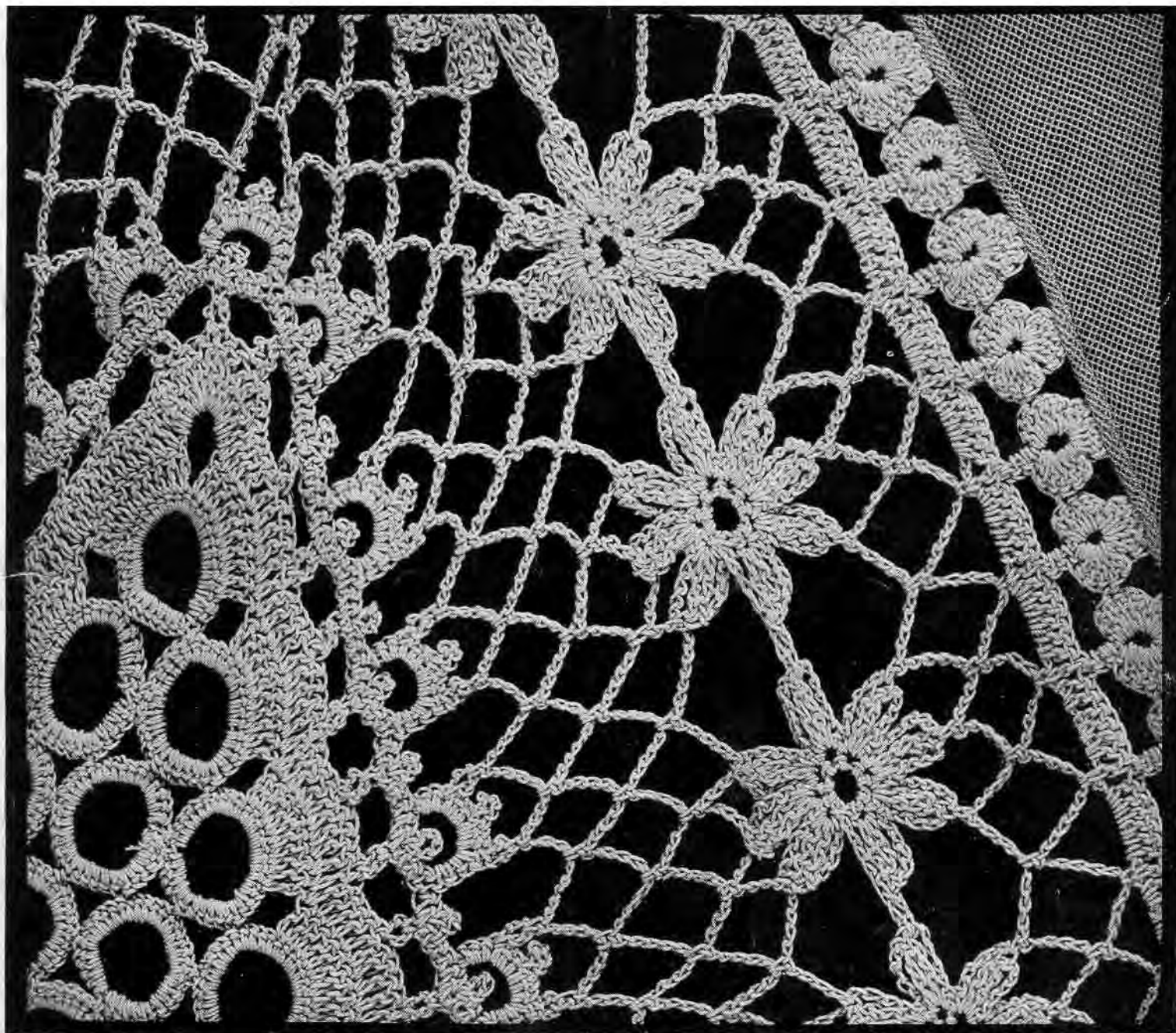

Irish Crochet Twist was used to make this Panel.

For Rings in Center.—Chain 19, join, 34 d. c. around ring, sl. st. into 1st d. c. fasten, make 25 rings joining as plate shows.

For Daisy.—Ch. 8 and join. 1st row: 8 d. c. in ring and join with sl. st. 2nd row: Ch. 5, 1 d. t. in 1st st. Thread over needle, work through 2 loops, thread over needle work through 2 loops, leaving 2 loops on needle, thread twice over needle, cro. into same place. loop over needle. work through 2 loops, thread over needle, work through 2 loops, thread over needle, cro. through last 3 loops on needle, chain 5, d. c. into same place.

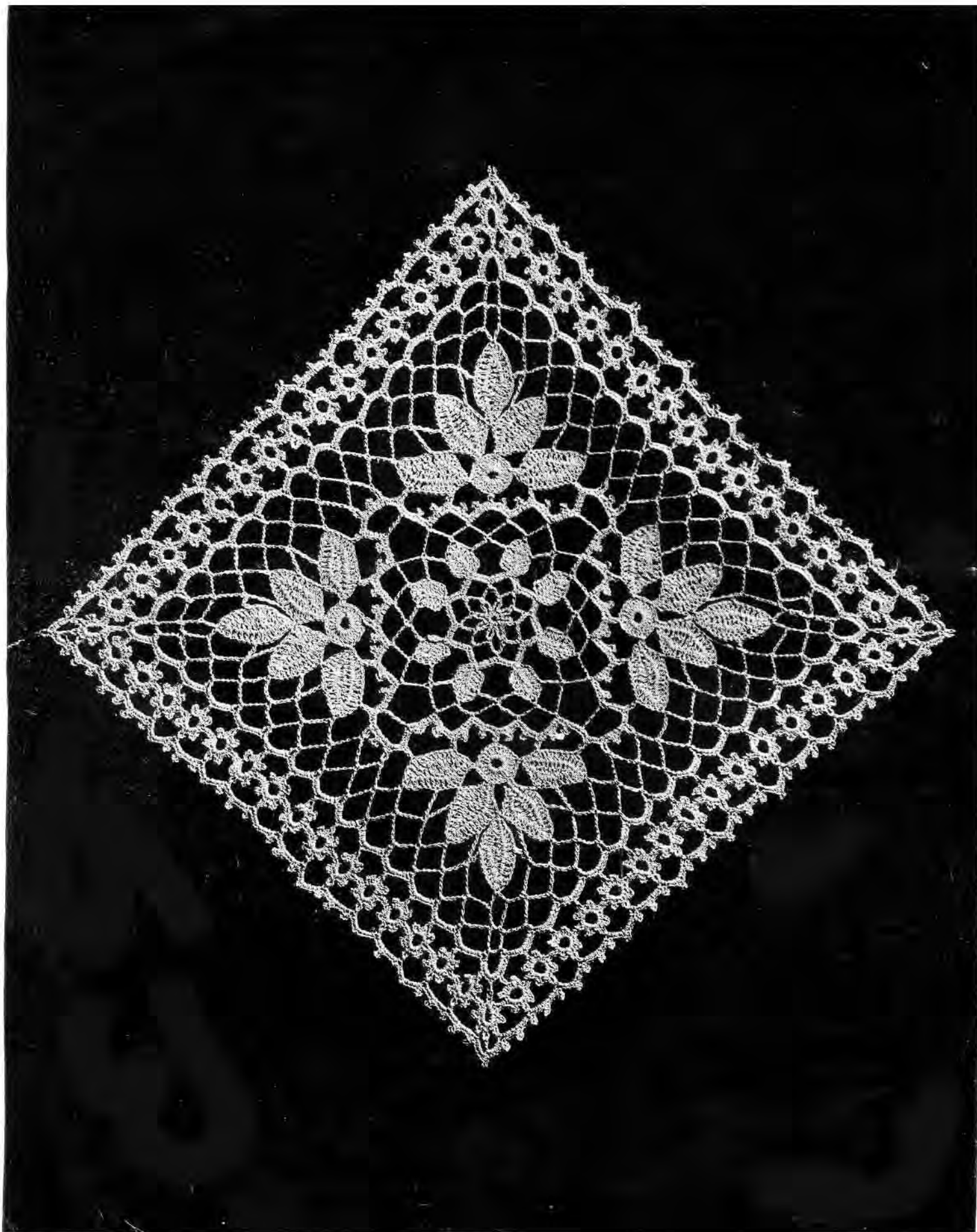
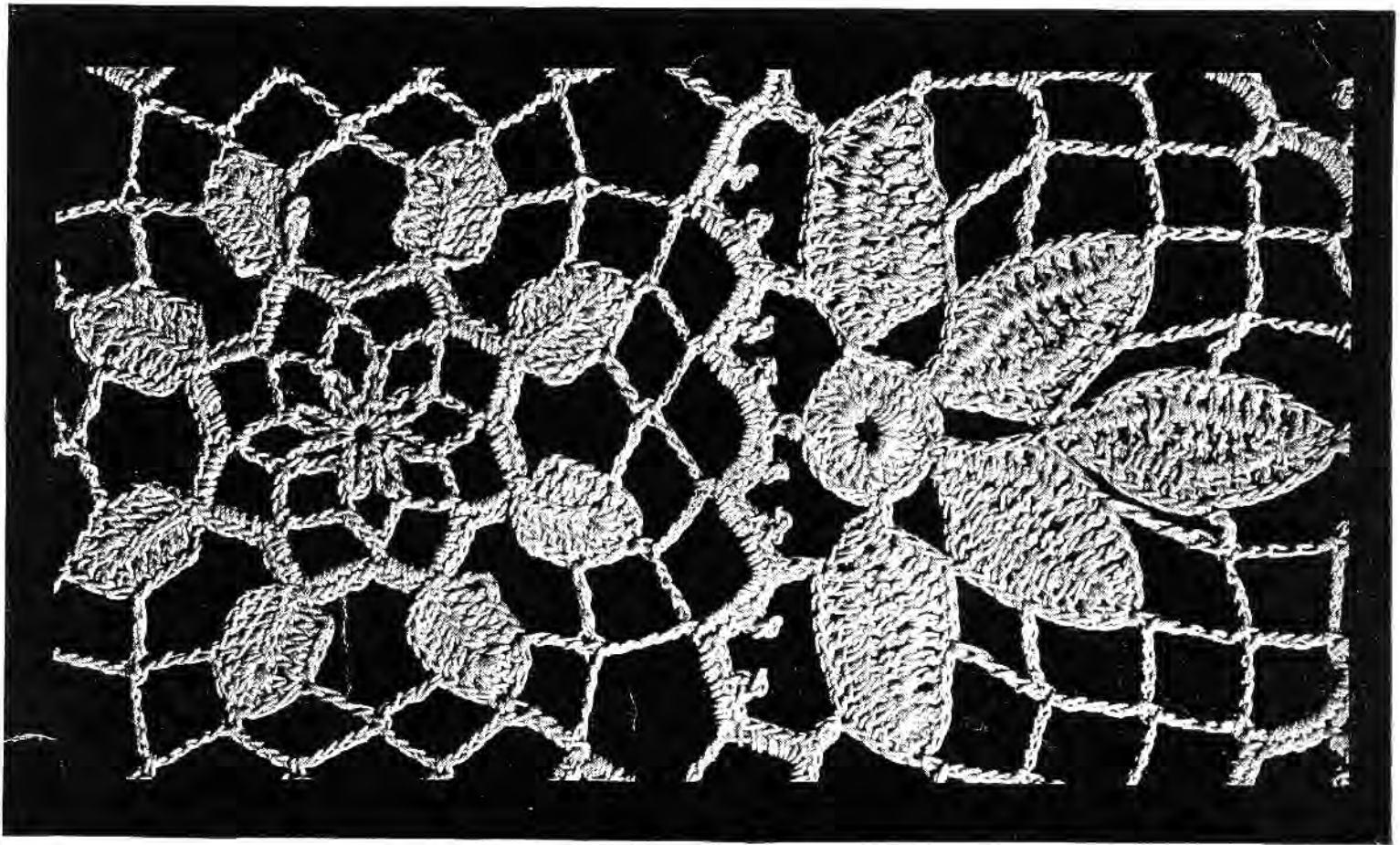

DOOR PANEL.

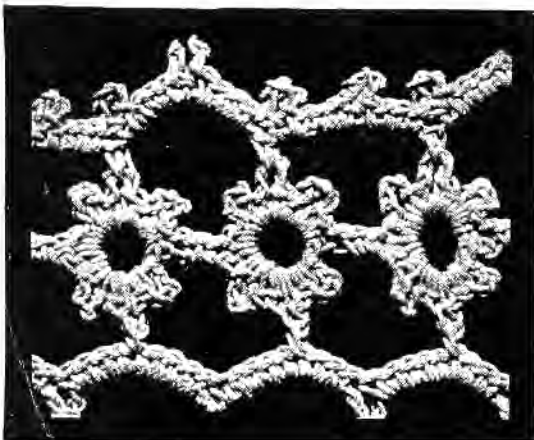
Exact size 13x13 inches.



ENLARGED DETAIL FOR PLATE No. 3.

Irish Crochet Twist was used to make this Panel.

For Center.—Chain 6, join with sl. st. 1st row: Chain 6, 1 d. c. in ring 7 times, ch. 6, 1 sl. st. in 1st st. of 1st 6 ch., 1 sl. st. in each of next 2 sts., 1 d. c. under ch. 2d row: Chain 6, 1 d. c. in next ch., 7 times, ch. 6, 1 sl. st. in 1st st. of next ch., 1 sl. st. in each of next 2 sts., 1 d. c. under ch. 3d row: Chain 7, 1 d. c. in each chain-loop around. 4th row: Chain 1, 4 d. c. under 1st ch., ch. 8, 1 sl. st. in fifth st. from hook, 1 sl. st. in each of next 3 sts. taking up only one loop of st.; reach across ch. and make 1 sl. st. to bring thread on right side of ch., ch. 3, 1 t. in 1st st. of ch., 1 t. in each of next 3 sts. (taking up one loop only), 5 t. in 4 ch. at end, 1 t. in each of next 4 sl. sts. down side of ch., ch. 3, 1 sl. st. in the sl. st. taken across end of ch., taking up both loops of st., 4 d. c. under ch. Repeat in each sp. around, join to 1st d. c. with sl. st. Break thread and fasten end. 5th row: Join thread with 1 d. c. in the 3d of the 5 t. made at end of leaf, * ch. 9, thread over hook twice, insert hook in 3d t. from the d. c. in end of leaf, ** thread over hook, pull a loop through, thread over, pull through two loops, thread over, pull through two loops, ** leaving two on hook, thread over hook twice, insert hook in 4th t. on next leaf, repeat from ** to **, thread over hook and pull through remaining 3 sts. on hook, ch. 9, 1 d. c. in the 3d of the 5 t. on top of leaf *. Repeat from * to * around, joining last 9 ch. to 1st d. c. with sl. st. Break thread, and fasten. 6th row: Sl. st. to center of 9 ch. * ch. 18 1 d. t. in 15th st. from hook, ch. 5, d. c. under next loop of 9 ch. until 3 loops are made. * Repeat from * to *. 7th row: 4 d. c. under 1st loop, ch. 5 for p. 4 d. c., 1 p., 4 d. c., 1 p., 4 d. c. all in same loop. Continue.



For Leaf.—Ch. 13, d. c. in 3d ch. from hook 2 t. in next 2 ch. 4 d. t. in next 4 ch. 2 t. in next 2 ch. 2 d. c. in next 2 ch. turn, 2 d. c. bet. first 2 st. 1 t. bet. ea. stitch to end. 5 t. in 2 remaining ch. Other side of leaf the same.

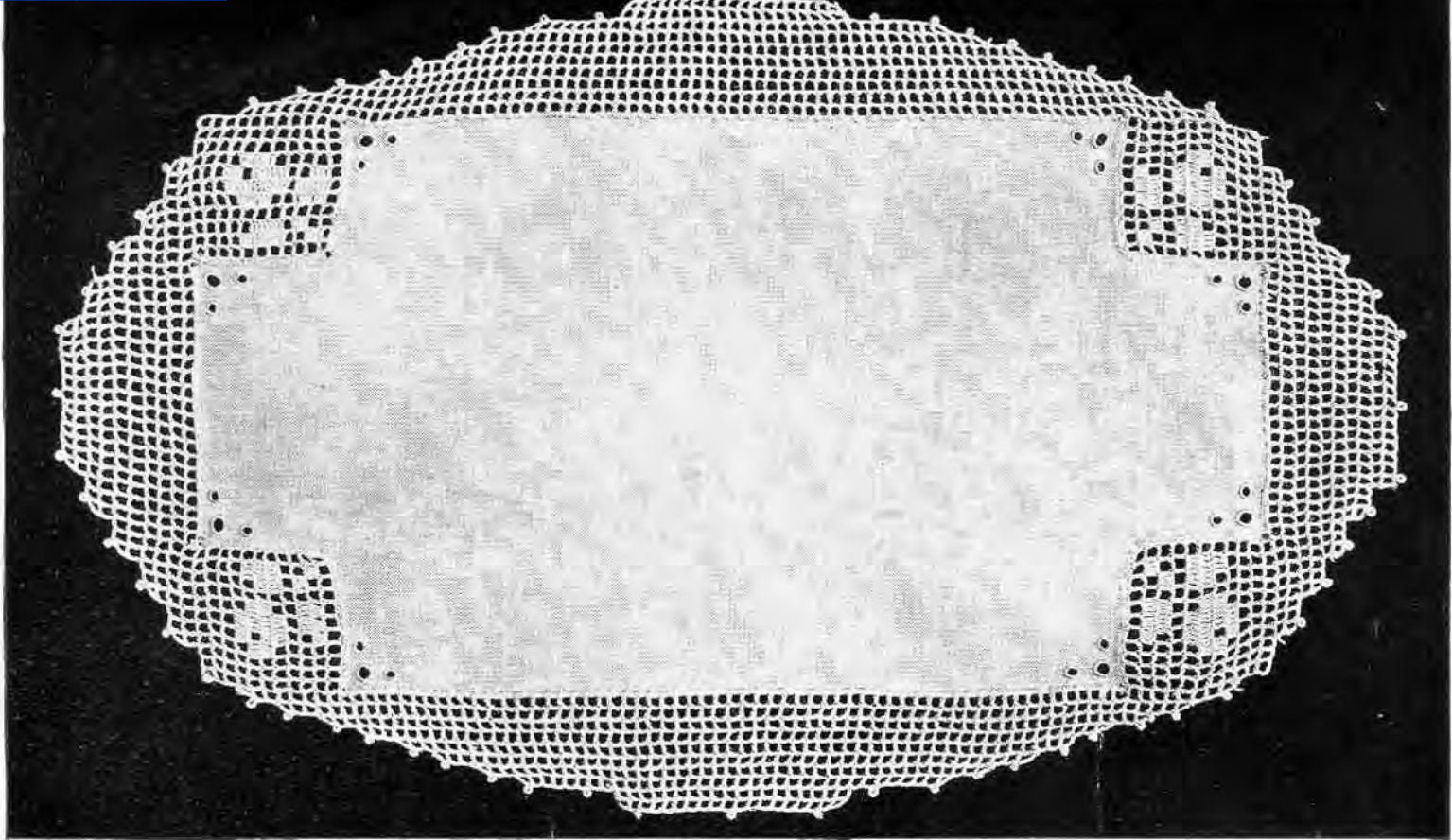
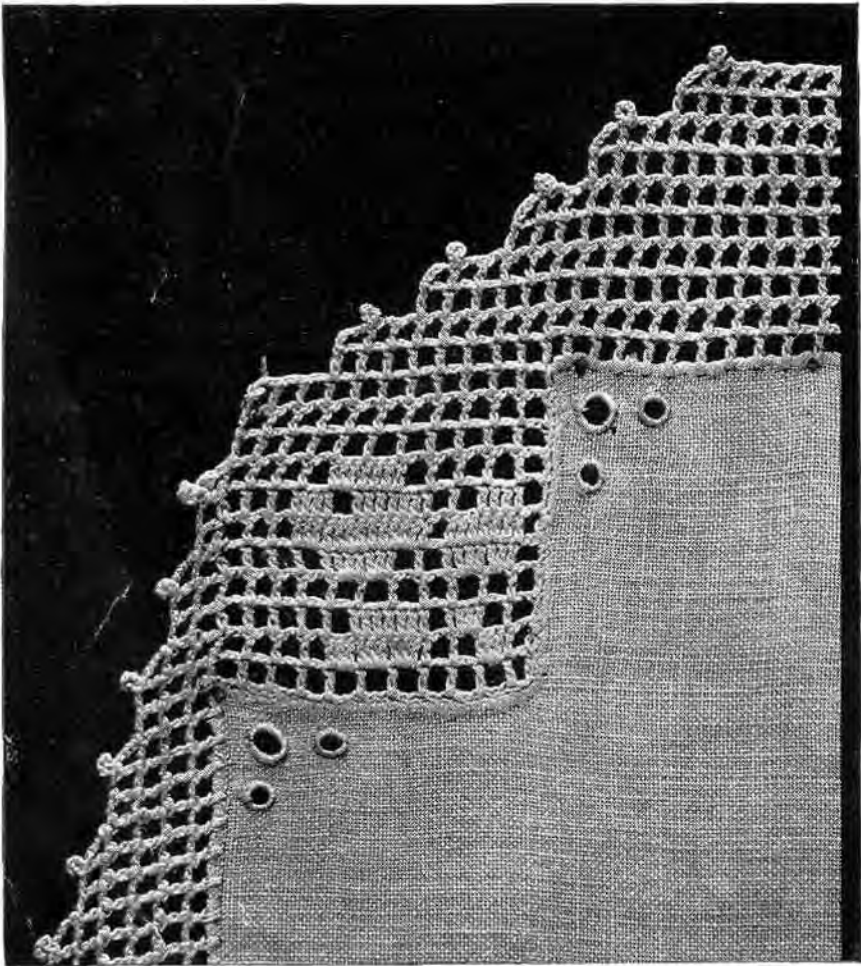

TRAY CLOTH.



No. 30 Mercerized Crochet Cotton was used to make the above cloth, which, if made exactly as shown, measures 16 by 9½ inches. By adding to the center of each side, may be made any desired size.

TRAY CLOTH.

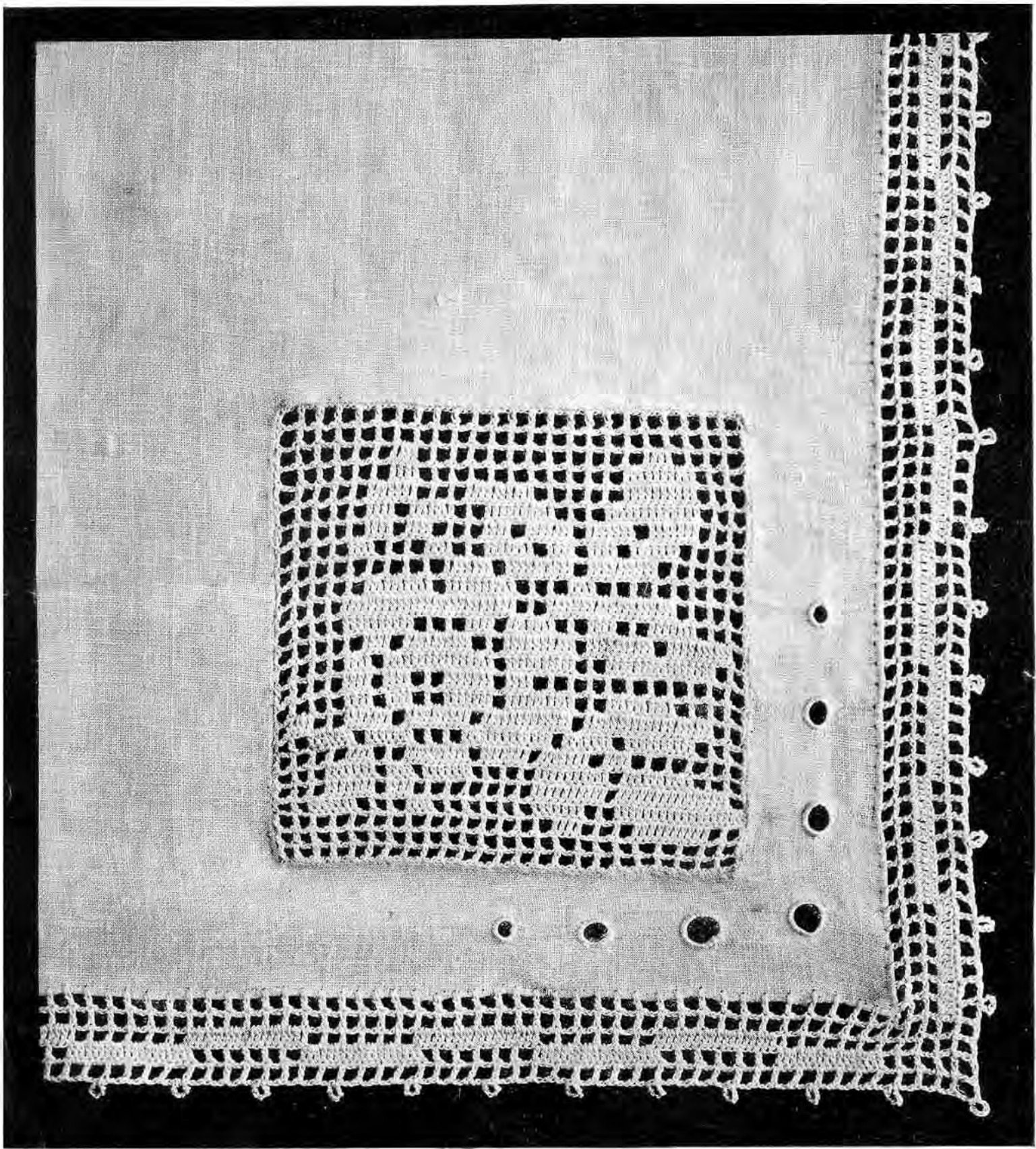
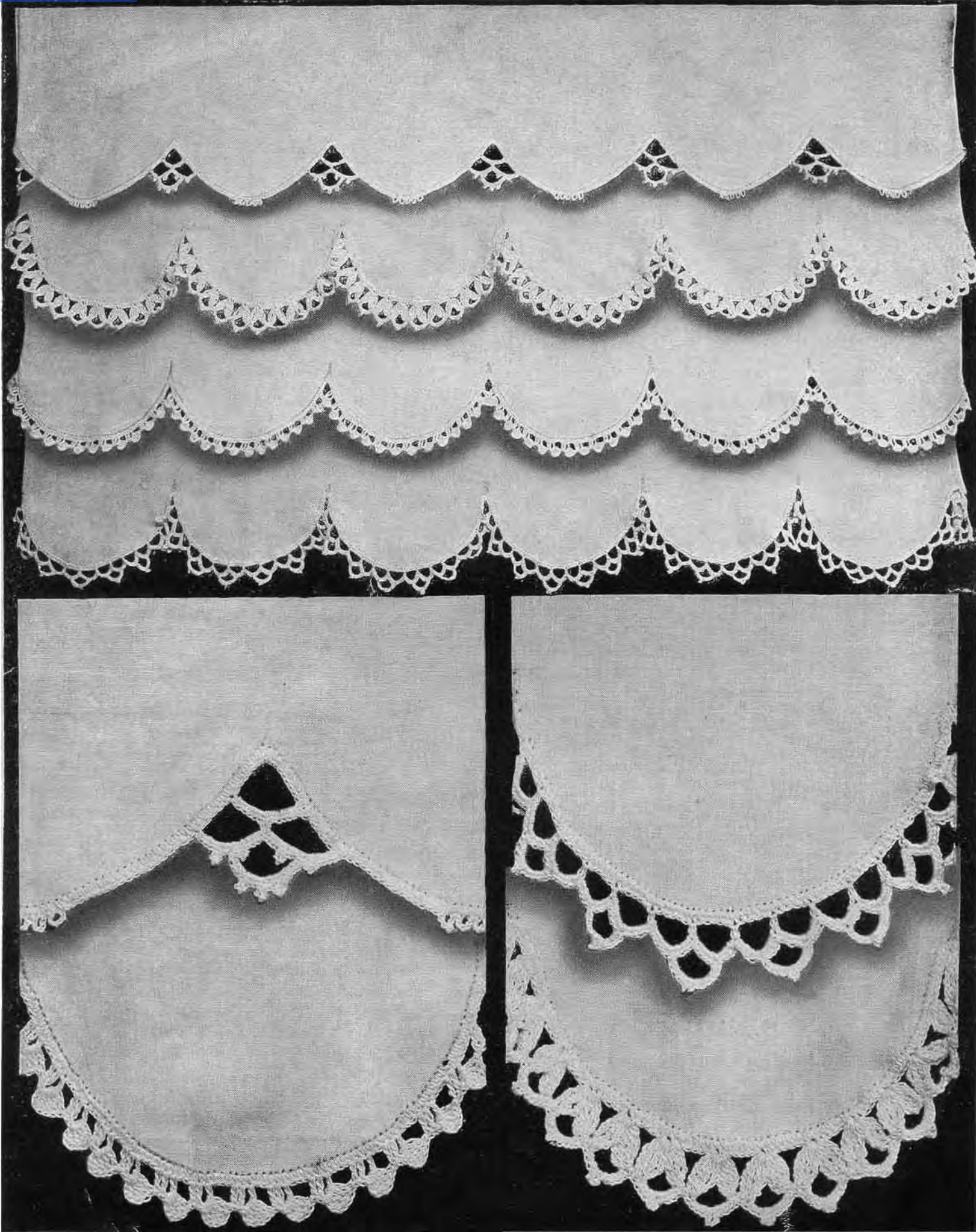


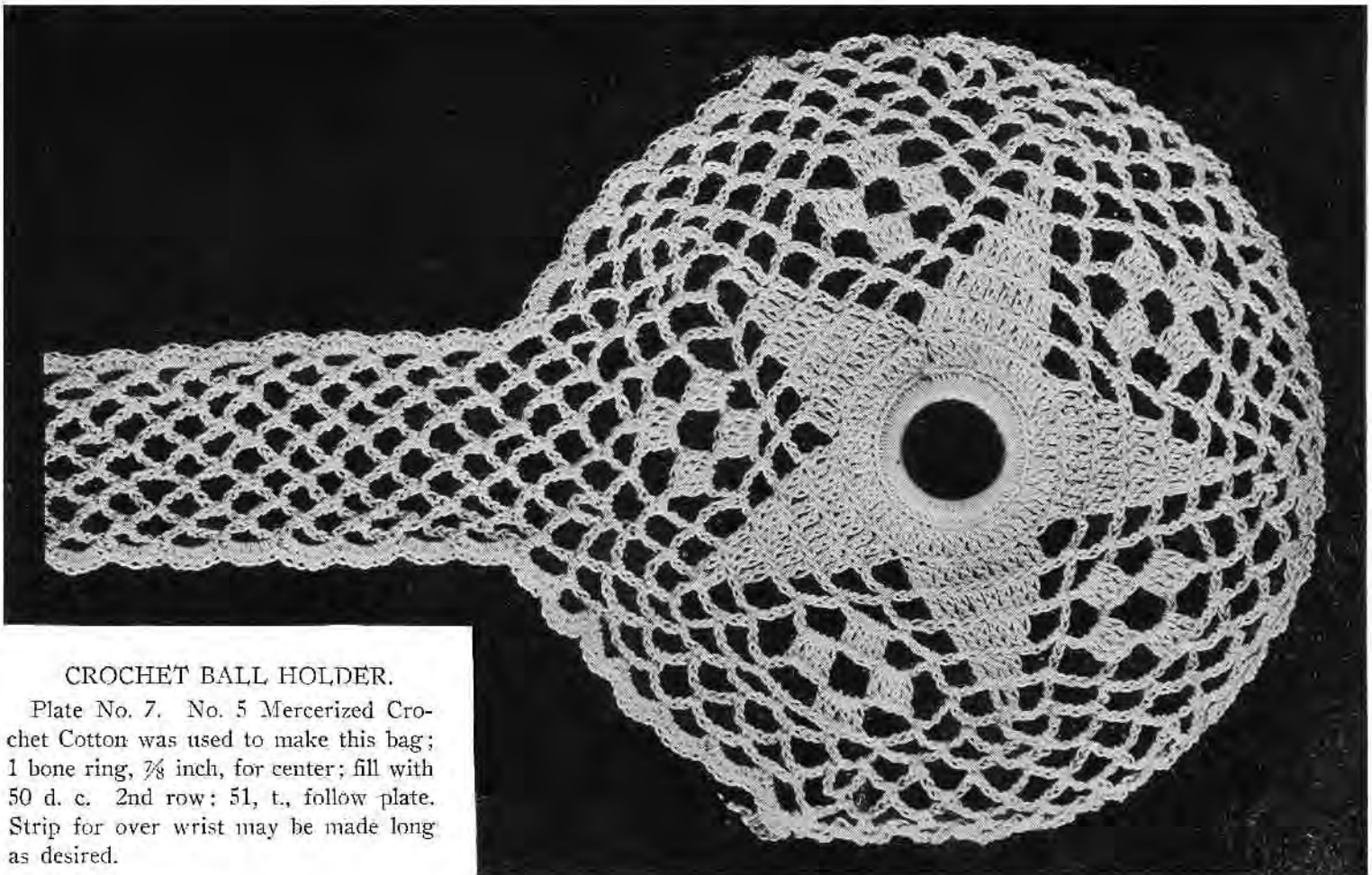
Plate No. 5. This dainty Filet Edge and Medallion may be used in a number of ways. A handsome Scarf, Tea or Luncheon Cloth or Between-Meal Cloth may be made by using edge as shown and a medallion in each corner. Dainty Tea Napkins may be made by using a medallion in one corner and edge as shown.

No. 40 Mercerized Crochet Cotton was used for above Tea Cloth.



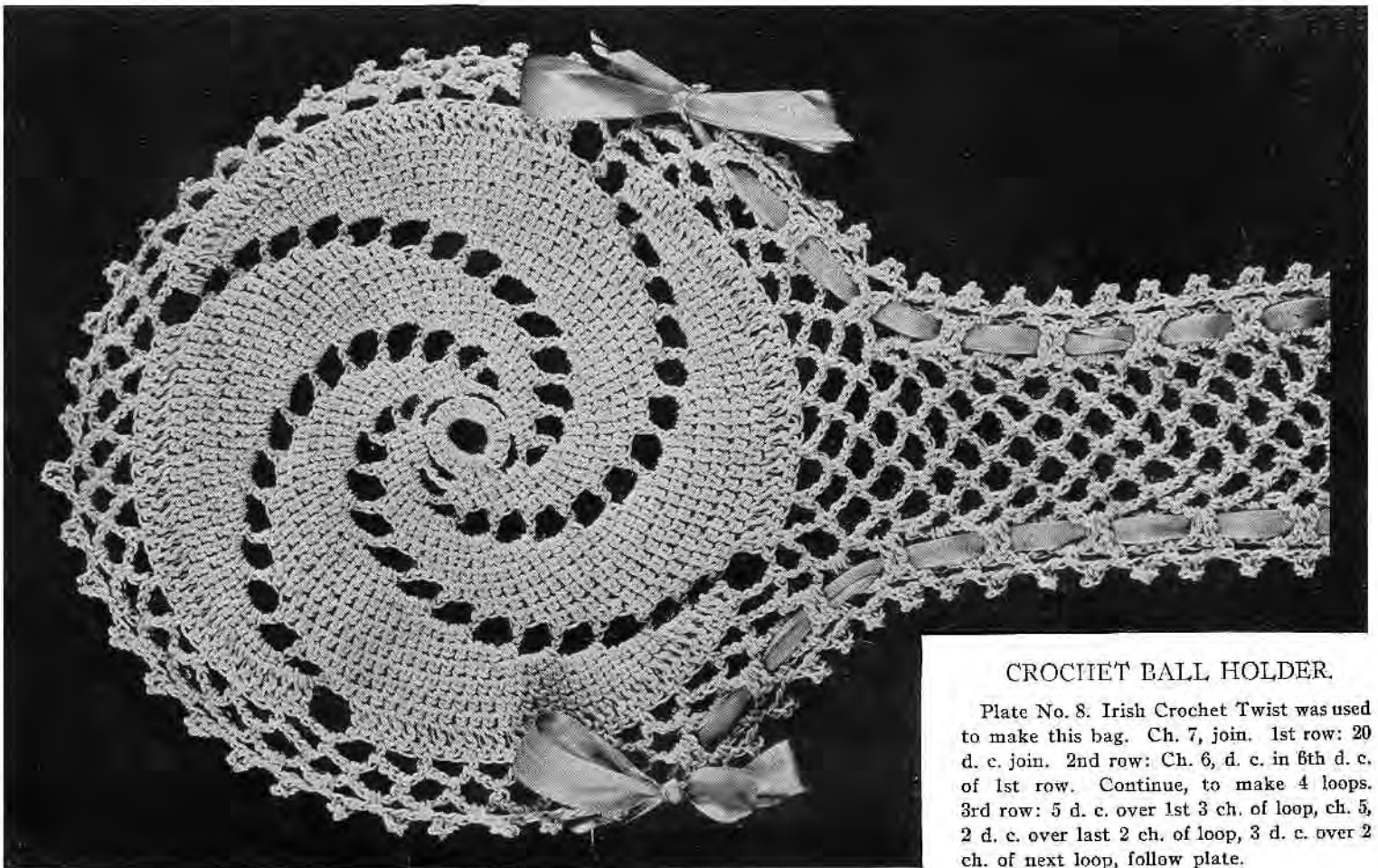
PILLOW CASE EDGINGS.

Plate No. 6. Cotton or Linen Tubing may be used, scallop marked with a glass or tea cup. Sheets may also be trimmed to match. By using No. 70 Thread above also make dainty handkerchief edges.



CROCHET BALL HOLDER.

Plate No. 7. No. 5 Mercerized Crochet Cotton was used to make this bag; 1 bone ring, $\frac{7}{8}$ inch, for center; fill with 50 d. c. 2nd row: 51, t., follow plate. Strip for over wrist may be made long as desired.



CROCHET BALL HOLDER.

Plate No. 8. Irish Crochet Twist was used to make this bag. Ch. 7, join. 1st row: 20 d. c. join. 2nd row: Ch. 6, d. c. in 6th d. c. of 1st row. Continue, to make 4 loops. 3rd row: 5 d. c. over 1st 3 ch. of loop, ch. 5, 2 d. c. over last 2 ch. of loop, 3 d. c. over 2 ch. of next loop, follow plate.

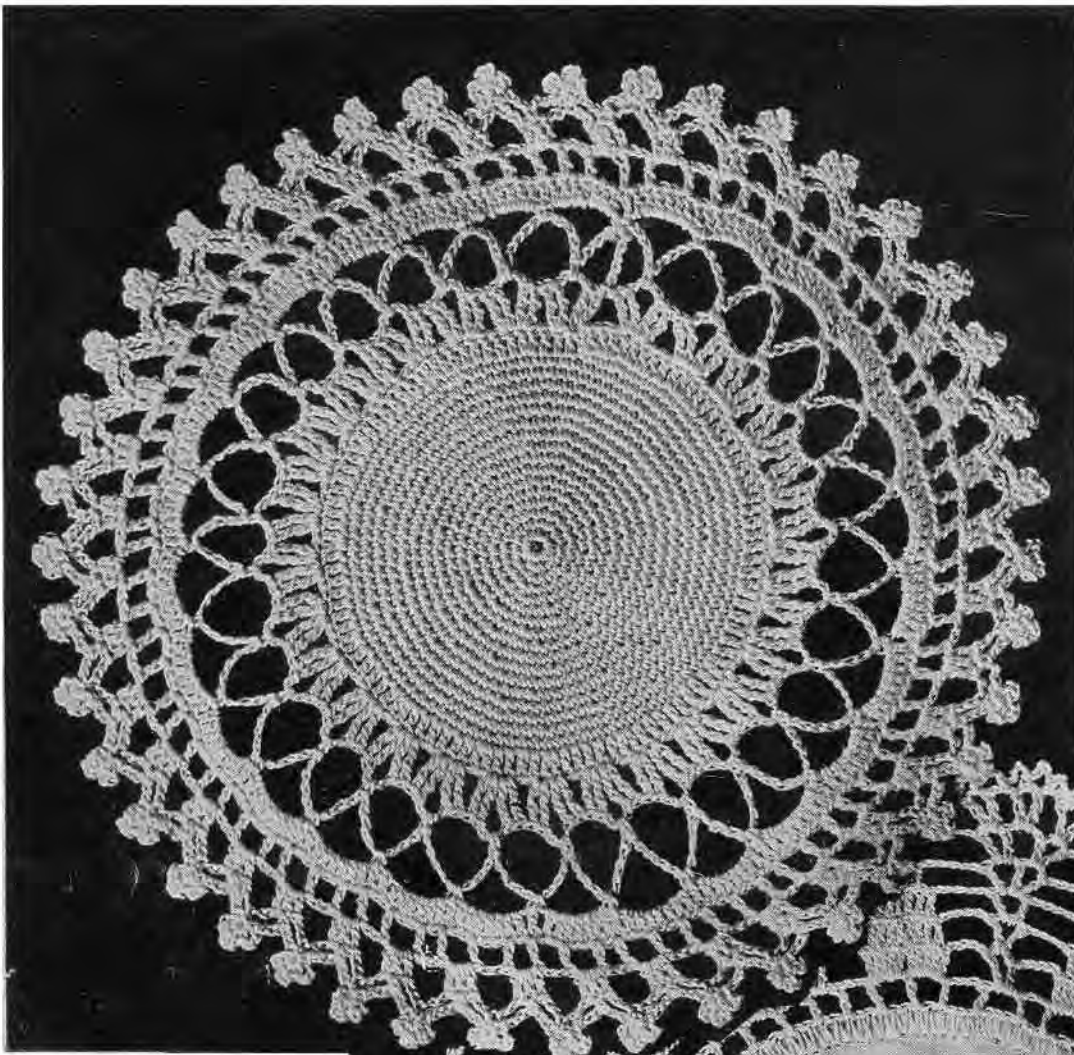

No. 30 Mercerized Crochet Cotton was used. By continuing center, Cup and Saucer and Plate sizes may be made, making Luncheon Set. Cut is actual size of Doily.

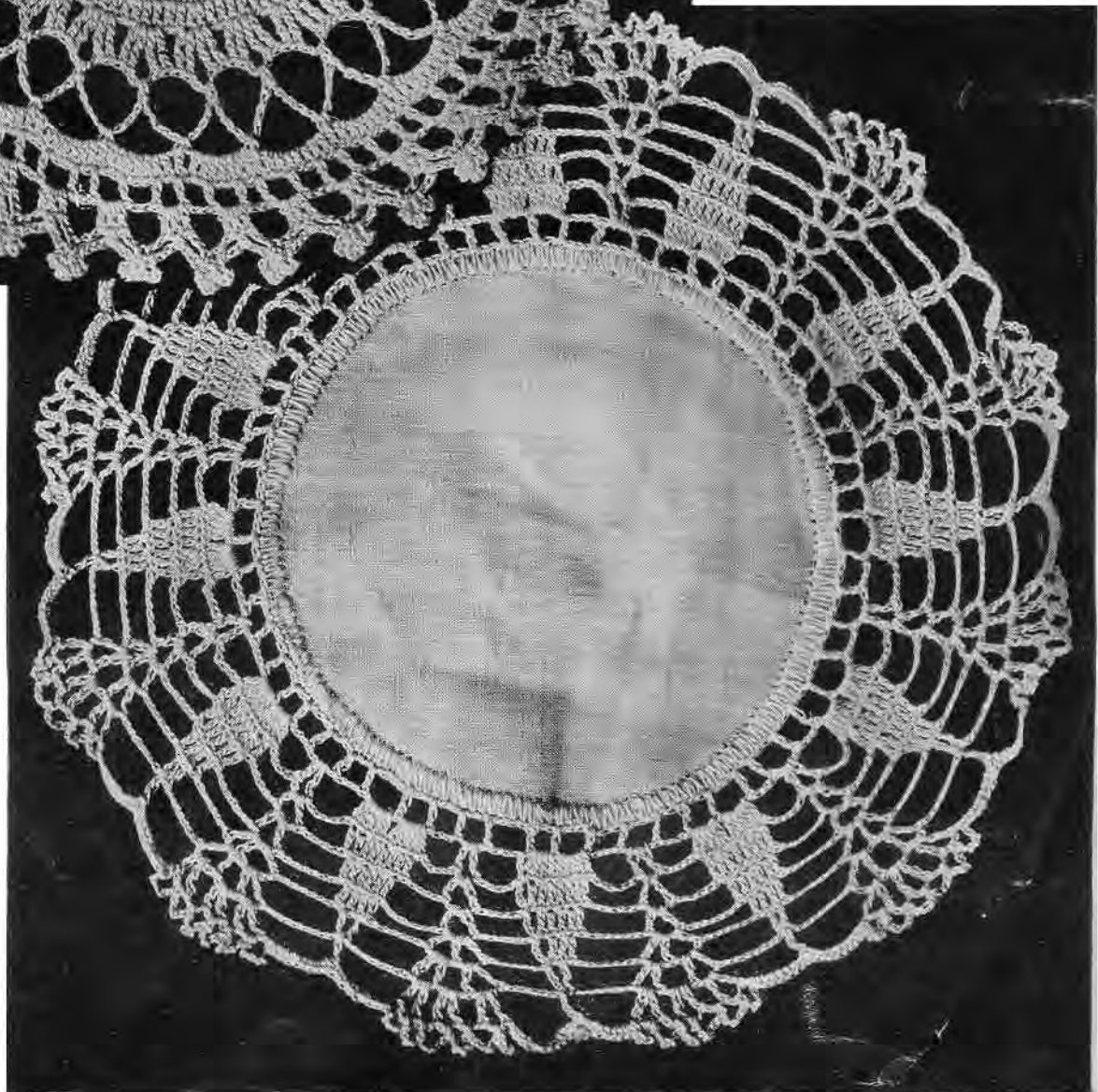

No. 30 Mercerized Crochet Cotton was used. By using larger Linen Center, entire Luncheon Set may be made. Cut is actual size of Doily.

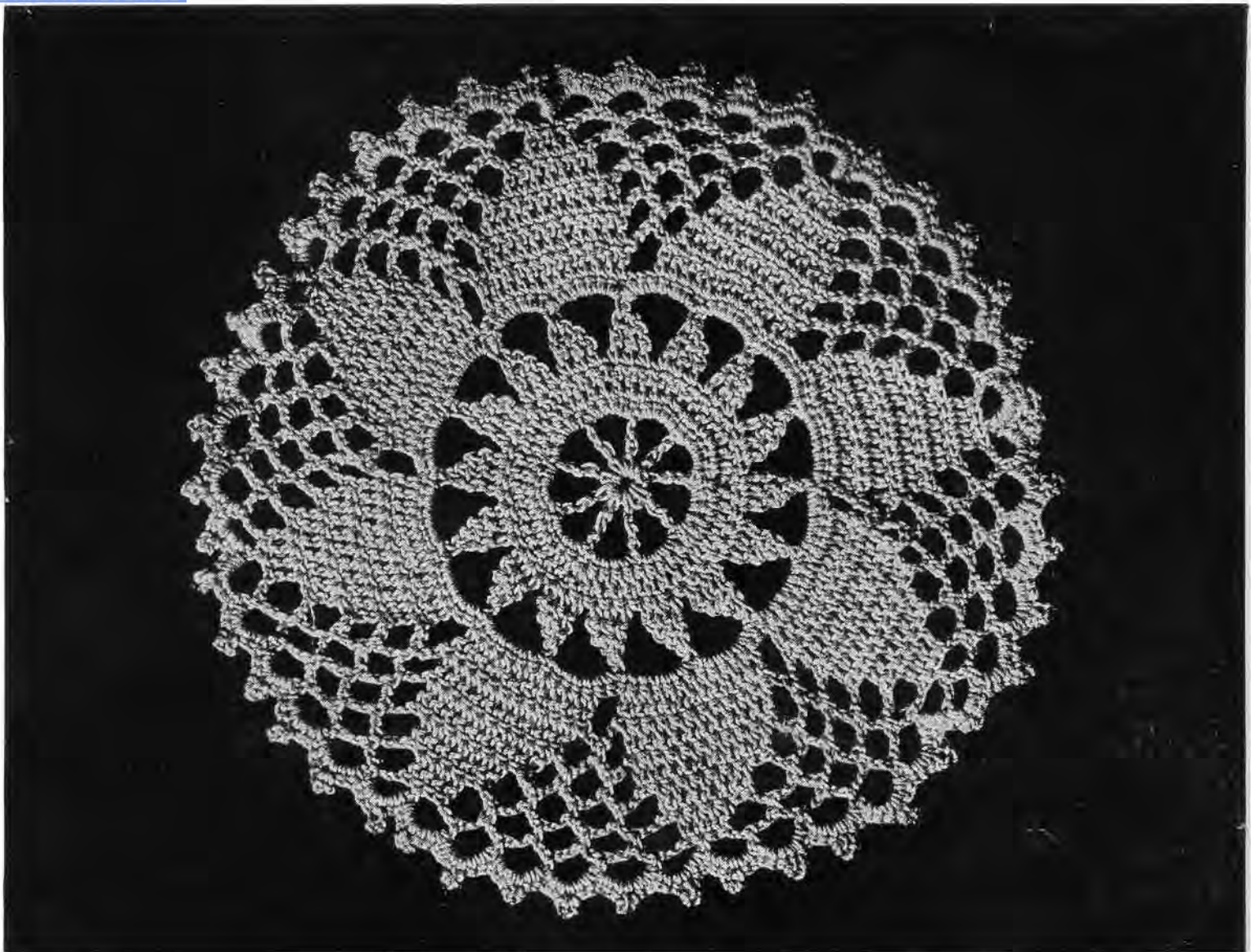
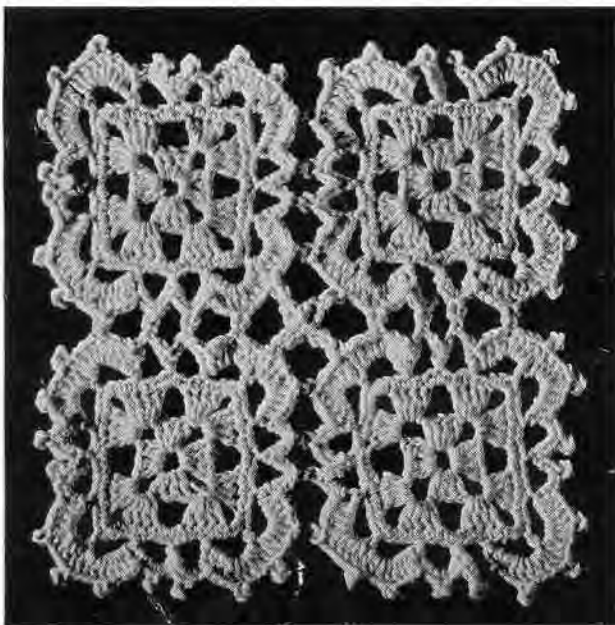


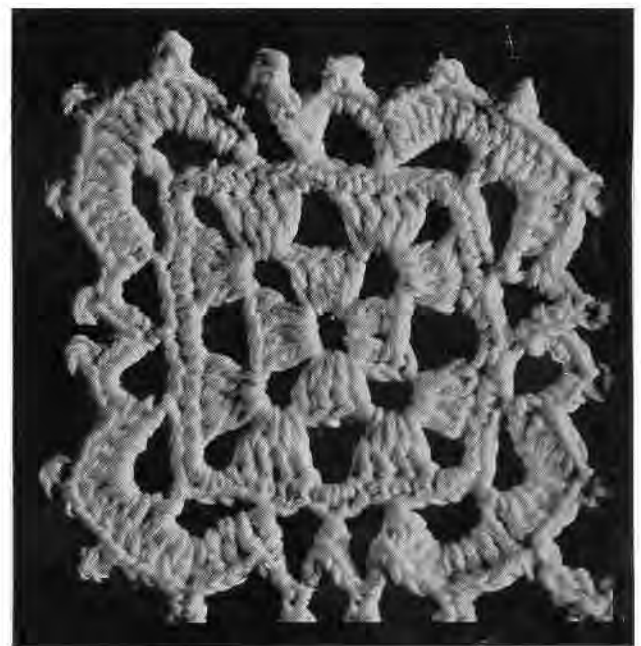

THE "ADELE" HUG-ME-TIGHT.

Made of Mercerized Perle Crochet Cotton.

If made exactly as shown, is size 38 and takes six balls of Cotton to finish.

Ch. 59 for lower edge of back.

1st Row: 1 t. in 5th ch. from hook, 1 t. in next ch. * ch. 1, skip 1 ch. make 3 t. in next 3 ch. repeat from *.

2nd Row: Turn, ch. 3, 1 d. c. bet. cluster of t., continue to end of row.

3rd Row: Turn, ch. 3, 2 t. under loop of 3 ch., ch. 1, 3 t. under next loop, continue to end of row.

4th Row: As 2nd. 5th Row: As 3rd.

6th Row: Turn, ch. 3, 1 d. c. bet. 2nd and 3rd cluster of t. * ch. 3, 1 d. c. bet. next 2 cluster, repeat from * 10 times. ch. 3, 1 d. c. in last t. of row. Make 3 rows of 12 clusters, then decrease next row as 6th, make 3 rows of 10 clusters, ch. 3, 2 t., 1 ch.,

3 t. under loop, * ch. 1, 3 t. under next loop, repeat from * 8 times. ch. 1, 3 t., ch. 1, 3 t. under last loop, increase every 4th row until you have 18 rows of clusters. 8 rows of 16 clusters to finish back.

Left Side Front.—6 rows of 6 clusters for shoulder, increase in 7th, 11th and 15th row.

Make 17 rows of 12 clusters to finish front.

Right side same as left.

Make 4 rows of clusters around jacket for border.

Edge.—1 d. c., 2 t., 1 d. c. bet. each cluster.

To Join Jacket Under Arm.—1 d. c. in 6th scallop from bottom, join 15 scallops with 2 ch. bet.
